

Both toads and frogs truly help us out,






By eating harmful insects that buzz all about.

- A frog is an amphibian
- More than 4,700 types of frogs can be found everywhere except the Antarctica
- A frog is cold blooded (poikilothermic)
- Their size ranges from 1 cm to 30 cm in length
- Frogs are able to lay 4,000 eggs at one time
- They have webbed feet and long hind legs which are used for jumping and swimming. They can jump over 20 times their height and some even higher!



**Snakes** - are amazing creatures that most are frightened of. Some fun facts about snakes are:

- 1. There are over 3000 different types of snakes
- 2. Snakes are in the class called reptiles and are cold blooded
- 3. Snakes live everywhere except where temperatures are frozen all year round
- 4. Snakes live in lakes, oceans, trees, rivers, forests, and even deserts
- 5. Snakes have scales whose major purpose it to help snakes move over hot and rough surfaces. The scales make the skin waterproof and are made of keratin like human fingernails.

On one big foot we move on the land and by sea,


And one thing's for sure - we're very slimy!

**SNAIL** — is the common name for gastropod mollusks that have shells and are found everywhere in the world—living on land and in fresh and salt waters. There are over 43,000 species of snails. Some additional amazing facts about snails include:

- Snails can only crawl. Even those that live in water can't swim. As they crawl they secrete a slime to act as a lubricant and an adhesive that helps them move across surfaces and even upside down. Snails travel at speeds that vary from slow (47 meters (154 feet) per hour) to very slow (10 meters (33 feet) per hour); making the snail one of the slowest creatures on Earth.
- Depending on the species, snails can live 5 25 years.
- Most snail species have a ribbon-like tongue called a radula that contains thousands of microscopic teeth. The radula works like a file, ripping food up into tiny pieces. Their diet consists of leaves and stems of crops and flowers.

- 3. Tortoises are herbivores they eat plants, fruit, grass, ferns, tree leaves.
